Shopping

Shrewsbury... over 700 shops all within the loop of the River Severn

Shrewsbury has a huge range of independent shops in a beautiful setting - little gems of retail heaven, shops that other towns have let go years ago. The zones below will help you explore the different areas of the town, each with its own character.

Zone 1 (Purple) Castle Foregate & Pride Hill HIGH STREET BRANDS & REFRESHMENTS!

Castle Gates runs by the train station into Castle Street, past the imposing castle then leads onto the pedestrian street Pride Hill. Here you will find the High Street shops you would expect from a modern town. The two shopping centres, Pride Hill Centre and The Darwin Centre, offer every convenience of under cover shopping, and contain many independent shops as well as the big brands. Cafes and pubs can be found throughout the area for refreshment stops.

Zone 2 (Blue) Mardol, Shoplatch & The River TRADITIONAL PUBS, CONTEMPORARY RESTAURANTS AND LOCAL PRODUCE

Head for the indoor market under the Clock Tower on Shoplatch for the best of local produce, local art and a host of other goods. Mardol heads down to the River Severn, with a range of unique cafes, shops, bars and delis. Pedestrian areas of Roushill and Hills Lane reveal even more independent shops. Follow the loop of the River and you find riverside restaurants, keep going and you will find the Quarry, riverside park.

Zone 3 (Green) St Mary's, Dogpole, Wyle Cop, St Alkmund's Place AN HISTORIC TREAT

From St Mary's to the bottom of Wyle Cop the hunched buildings house interesting shops, cafes, restaurants and hotels. The oldest part of Shrewsbury, hold the best in 21st Century shopping and eating. Behind St Mary's Church you will find the Parade Shopping Centre, two floors of unique shops and cafes. Fashion, niche homewares, gifts and food can all be found on Dogpole, and Wyle Cop many within the stunning black & white buildings. Head right into the heart of Shrewsbury to St Alkmund's Square, Butcher Row & Fish Street.

Zone 4 (Pink) High Street & The Square FASHION BOUTIQUES & COFFEE HOUSES

Welcome to The Square at the heart of the town. High Street, Milk Street and Princess Street are all to be found near by. What a browsers paradise. You won't be able to resist exploring the shuts off these streets - Peacock Passage, Golden Cross Passage and the splendidly named Grope Lane.

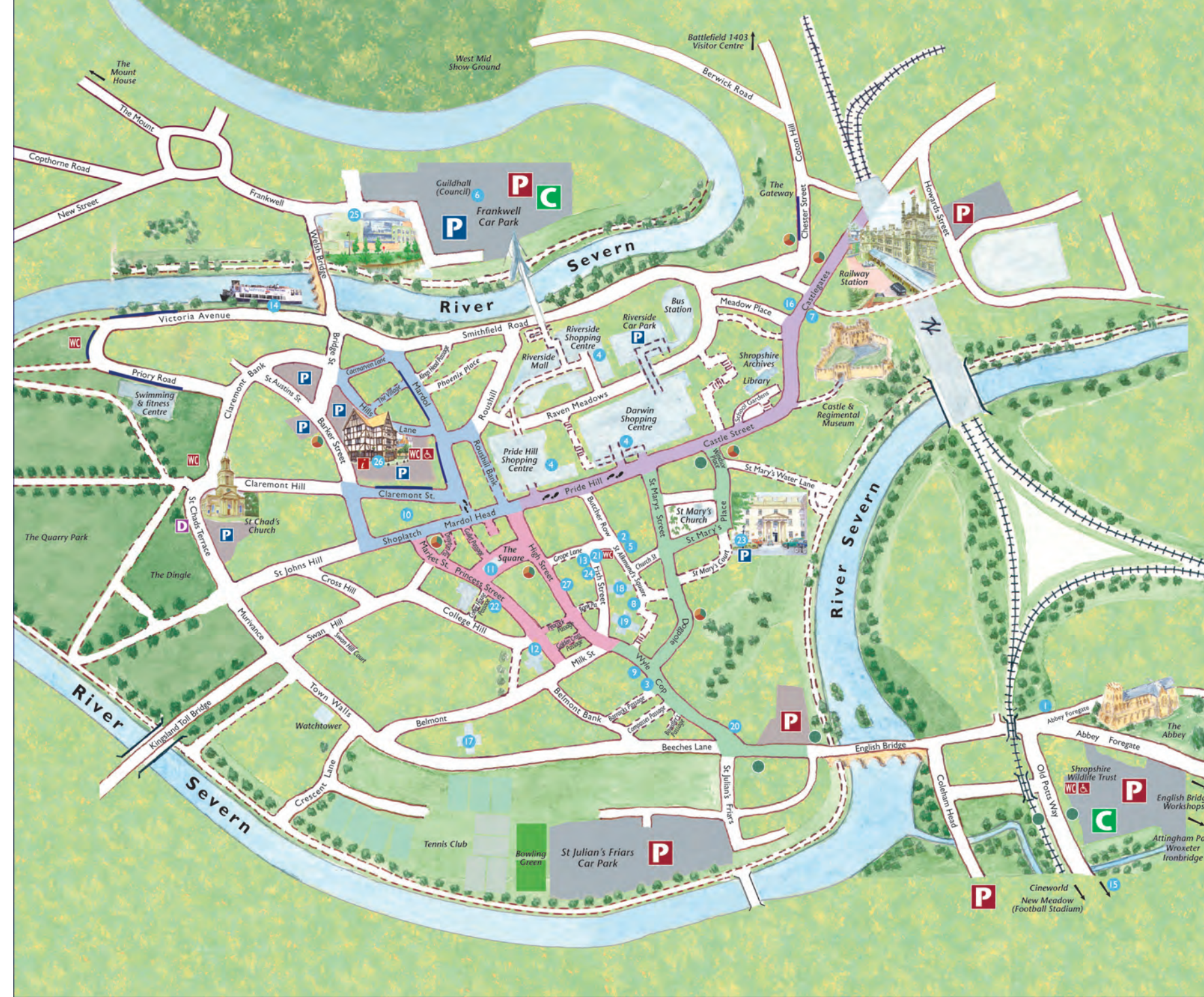
